Problem-Oriented Policing

Implement enforcement strategies that address specific neighborhood crime and quality of life issues.

Seek crime solutions before they occur

Crime patterns drives police activity

Management/research dictates police activity

Target patrol

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Data-Driven Crime Fighting

Deploy police personnel and resources to focused problem areas in the most efficient and effective manner.

Review of crime types (drug house, robbery, shootings etc)

Analysis of perpetrator-offender characteristics/patterns

Analysis of type and frequency of calls for service in a location

Use of available technology to monitor public surveillance cameras

Extract offender from the neighborhood

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Directed Enforcement

Utilize crime data to track crime patterns in order to identify, arrest and remove the perpetrator(s) and contributing factors; and prevent future crime opportunities.

Identify the crime patterns (B&E, Auto Theft, Carjacking, Armed Robbery)

Identify trending

Deploy additional resources based on crime data/mapping

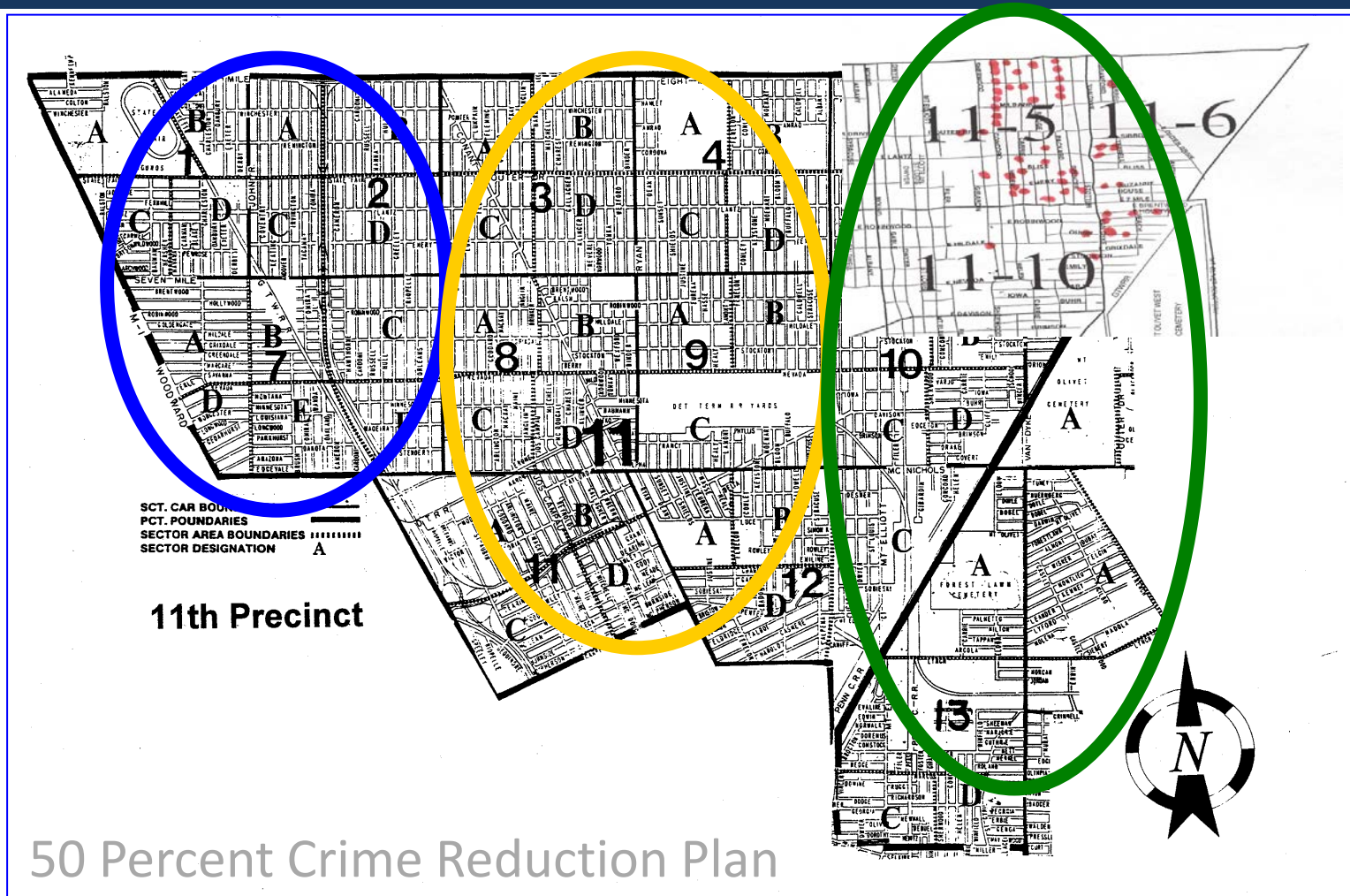

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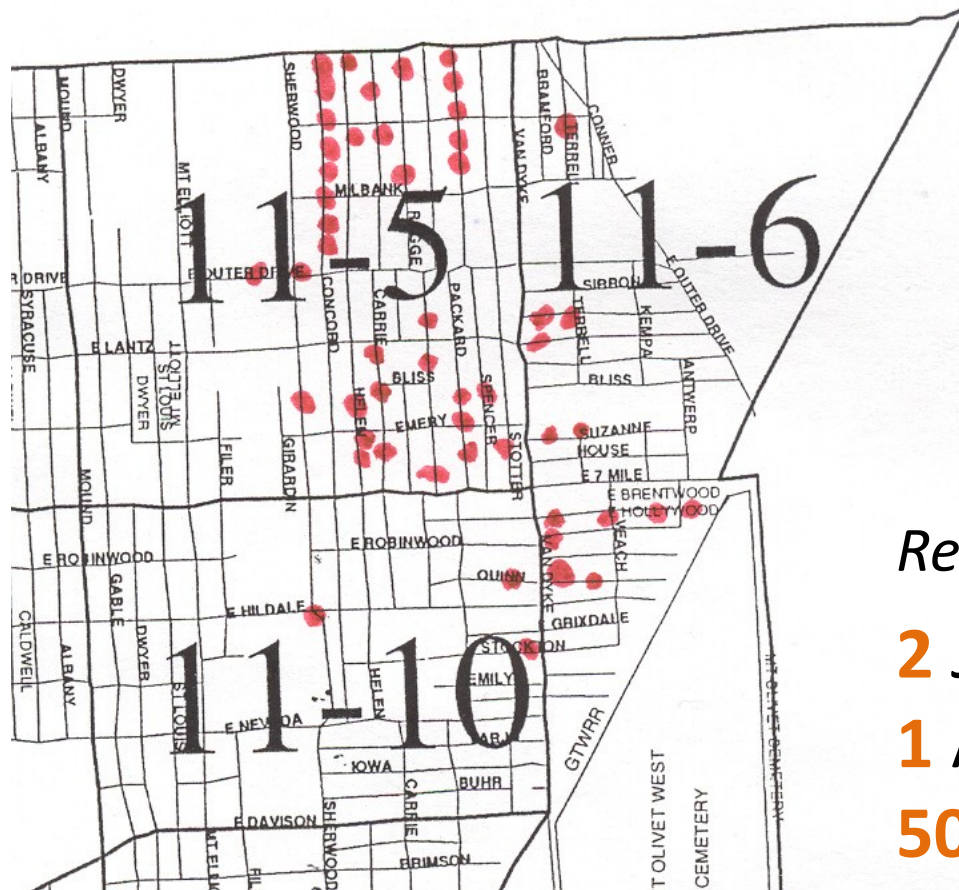

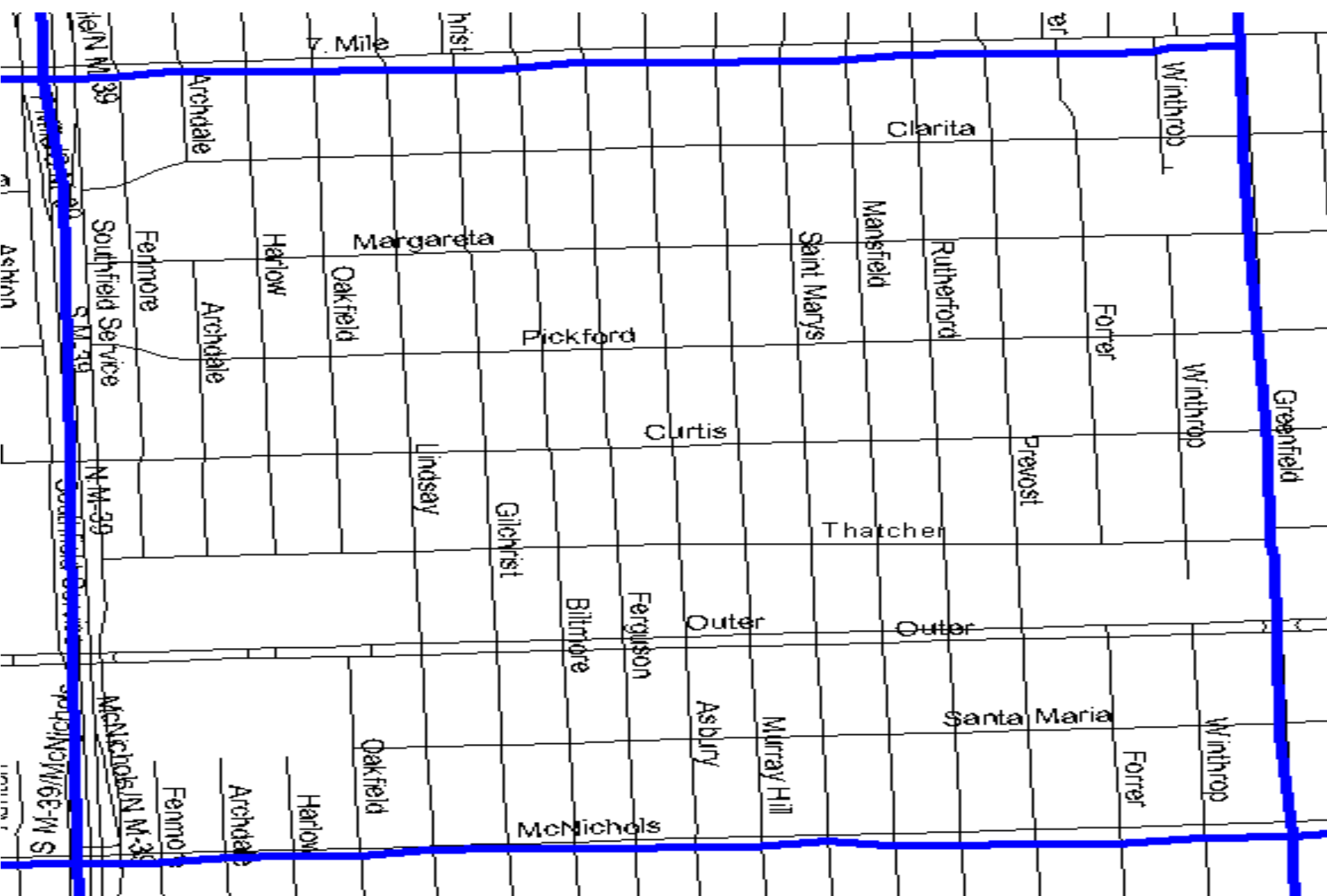
